Did you know...? Data from Clinton County's 11th & 12 Graders 2008-2009 Ohio Youth Survey

- 53 % drank beer and 58% drank other alcohol in the last 12 months
- 47% feel adults in the community think it is "a little wrong" or "not wrong at all" for youth to drink alcohol
- 72 % indicate it is "sort of" or "very" easy to get some alcohol
- 24% had ridden in a vehicle driven by someone who had been drinking alcohol during the past 30 days
