### 063-018 APPROVE RESOLUTION TO IMPLEMENT GRADE LEVEL CENTERS

Motion by Roberts, seconded by Murphy to approve the following Resolution to Implement Grade Level Centers.

WHEREAS, this Board has received a recommendation from the Superintendent of the Wilmington City School District ("District") that a change from assigning students to neighborhood elementary schools to elementary grade level centers will be advantageous to the District's educational program; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent has provided the Board with a comprehensive plan to accomplish a change from the current neighborhood schools configuration to elementary grade level centers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of the Wilmington City School District, County of Clinton, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>: The Board supports the reconfiguration of its elementary buildings to change from neighborhood schools to grade level centers beginning with the start of the 2018-2019 school year for the following reasons:

- 1) The grade level configuration change for students in grades Kindergarten through five will bring about socio-economic equity within the District, create unity for all elementary students who reside within geographic boundaries of the District and increase opportunities for elementary students to interact and build relationships with same age peers prior to advancing to sixth grade at Wilmington Middle School.
- Grade level centers will increases efficacy and consistency for professional educators and support staff assigned to buildings serving students in grades Kindergarten through five. Grade level centers will provide opportunities for increased collaboration among staff members and improve new teacher mentoring. Creation of grade level centers will also improve educational data analysis, creation of common assessments, and development of consistent lesson plans as well as evaluation of student achievement.
- 3) Removing neighborhood elementary boundaries will provide stability and consistency for all elementary students by eliminating the need for the intra-district transfer process.
- 4) The current elementary student day is from 9:15-3:45 (6 instructional hours). The proposed change will be from 9:15-3:30 (5.75 instructional hours). This equals 43.75 hours for the school year based on our calendar days. This amount of time exceeds the state standard by 96 hours needed in a school year.
- 5) The proposed grade level configuration transportation plan will not increase the overall time needed for busing. The transportation plan will also create efficiencies in routing that currently do not exist due to elementary neighborhood boundaries.

**Section 2:** Grade level centers shall be configured as follows:

Preschool and fifth grades East End Elementary School
Kindergarten, first and second grades
Third and fourth grades Denver Place Elementary School

<u>Section 3</u>: It is found and determined that all formal actions of the Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, or otherwise in compliance with the law.
